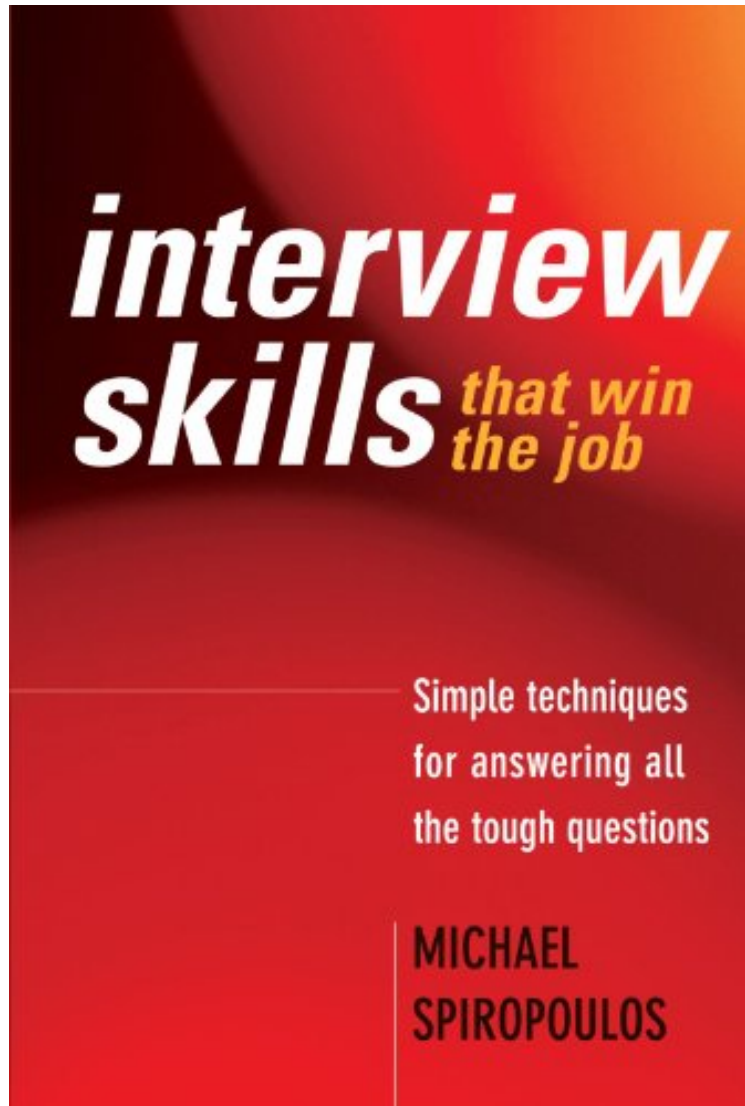

best one. I'm in Australia and the book translates quite well to our market. The book does not talk down to me, like many other popular books. The language in this book is extremely clear and the author gives a method rather than a set of predetermined responses for the interview to memorise. The author uses a method of context\ action\ result, which is a method that is useful for most modern behavioural questions (eg, "Give me an example of when you did X "). I'm left with the impression Spirapoulos would make a great 'in real life' coach. The final section is 10 responses to common interview questions, with an emphasis on learning the principles of making up the good answer, and not rote learning. The book does not fall into the trap of obsessing too much on the really difficult questions like how to explain a firing, which suited me, as I am after a set of core skills. There are useful exercises such as NLP exercises, and an explanation about low self confidence in how this comes about. Throughout the book he gets the sense you are talking to someone who has actually tutored many clients and has a hard gained understanding of interviewing in the real world.
