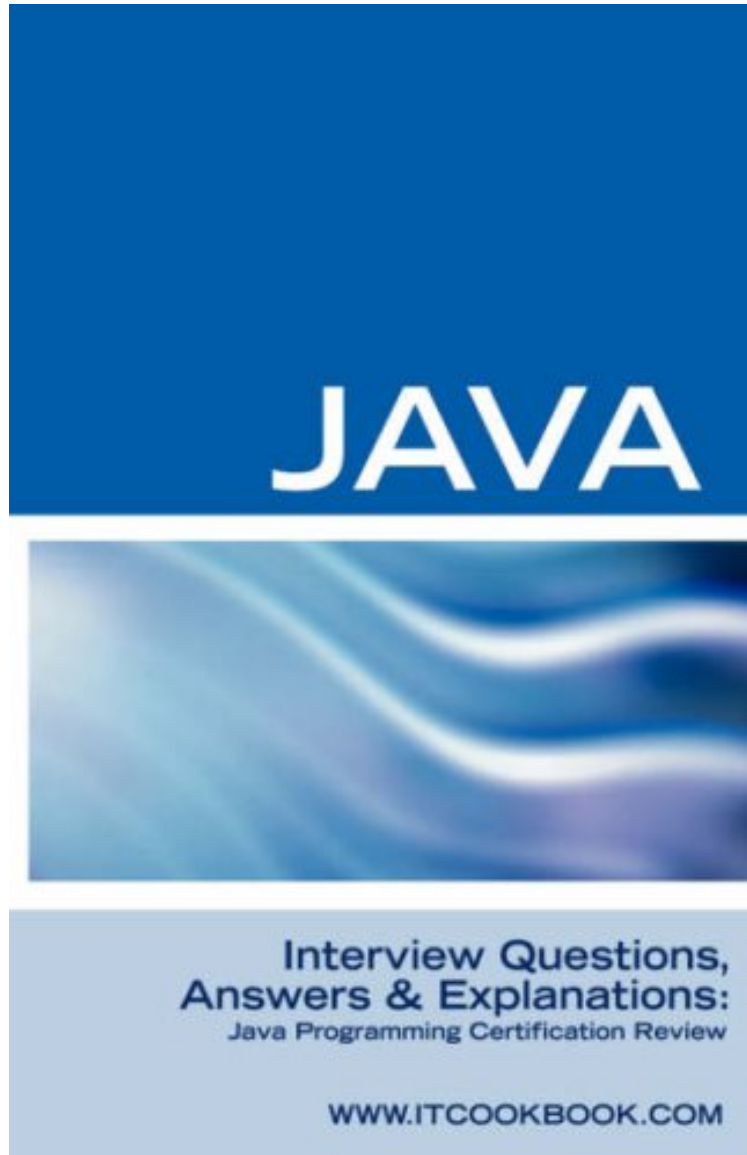

True, many of the questions are very technical. But I believe that in this way the book can be used to screen technical candidates as well as prepare for an interview. The book has some general questions as well: Example: Garbage Collection Guarantee Does garbage collection guarantee that a program will not run out of memory? This sort of question and answer information helps candidate with more open-ended questions and answers. With regard to the expense - I find that you get what you pay for, and this book offers information for people who need help right away. If you have time for costly training (thousands), and many weeks of preparation - then perhaps that is a better route. but if you are interested in saving much time and getting an idea about the topic of Java, then you should consider purchasing this book and others.
