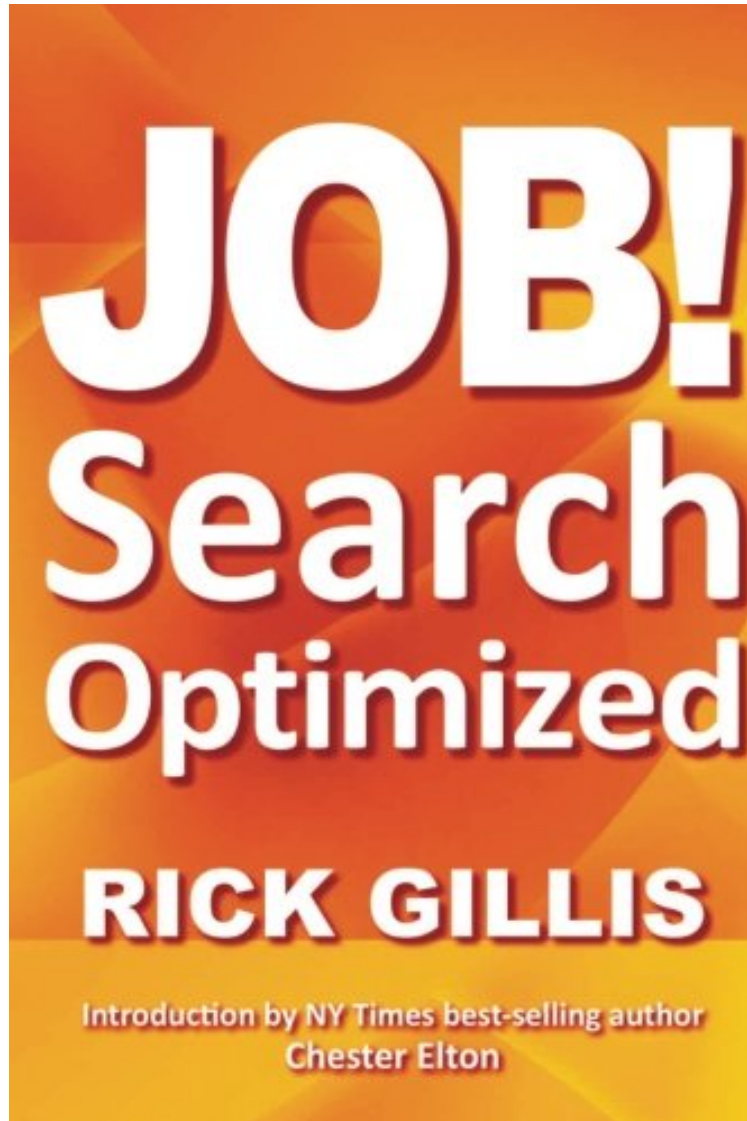

Most of my jobs have been referrals from friends, so even though I have been in the workforce for 30+ years, I have had only one or two jobs that were cold-call application / interview situations. Rick's book was a tremendous help in working my resume for impact. In particular, I appreciated his methods for structuring the resume with "results" as the focus. After applying for hundreds of job openings I realized I was disqualifying myself from consideration due to my resume. The traditional resume format is now a thing of the past. Things such as your address, phone number and font size could keep you from scoring your next great opportunity. Approximately two weeks after reading the book, I was able to get multiple interviews.

Revised and updated for 2015, "Job!" is a powerful job search book focusing on providing the reader with the core of what employers want--an expression from the job seeker on what value they will bring to the organization. Without that statement Gillis contends that the interview is a waste of both party's time. Rick Gillis further provides simple but ingenious information on how to successfully navigate resume filtering software and further advises the reader on how to craft a resume that recruiters will appreciate and follow up on. Additionally this newly updated and revised edition contains a chapter introducing you to best practices when utilizing social media in your job search. Samples and examples are included.

From Kirkus s At first glance, Gillis claim to help readers find a job in one day feels like a late-night infomercial, but this thin volumes three-step plan for landing employment or moving up the ladder is surprisingly practical. An increasing number of companies use filtering software that rejects rsums before they are even read by humans, so today's job search is not about getting selected, says Gillis. Instead, its about not getting eliminated. While this automated rejection may seem daunting to the unemployed, the authors breezy, conversational style makes the job hunt less frightening. However, getting the telephone call that lands the interview is the major theme of this book. Gillis innovative (and perhaps uncomfortable) message is to stop randomly sending out traditional rsums, which he calls obituaries, because old style rsums only deal with the past. The author suggests that job seekers should use his signature, one-page Short-Form rsum as a template, and an example is included in the books appendix. An entire chapter is devoted to learning how to recognize and apply keywords, which could help an applicants Short-Form rsum receive points from filtering software and make its way to the top of the selection process. Each section of the rsum is explained in simple detail, and as Gillis describes it: Your Short-Form Resume is your job search tease and your target is the hiring manager whose attention you want.
