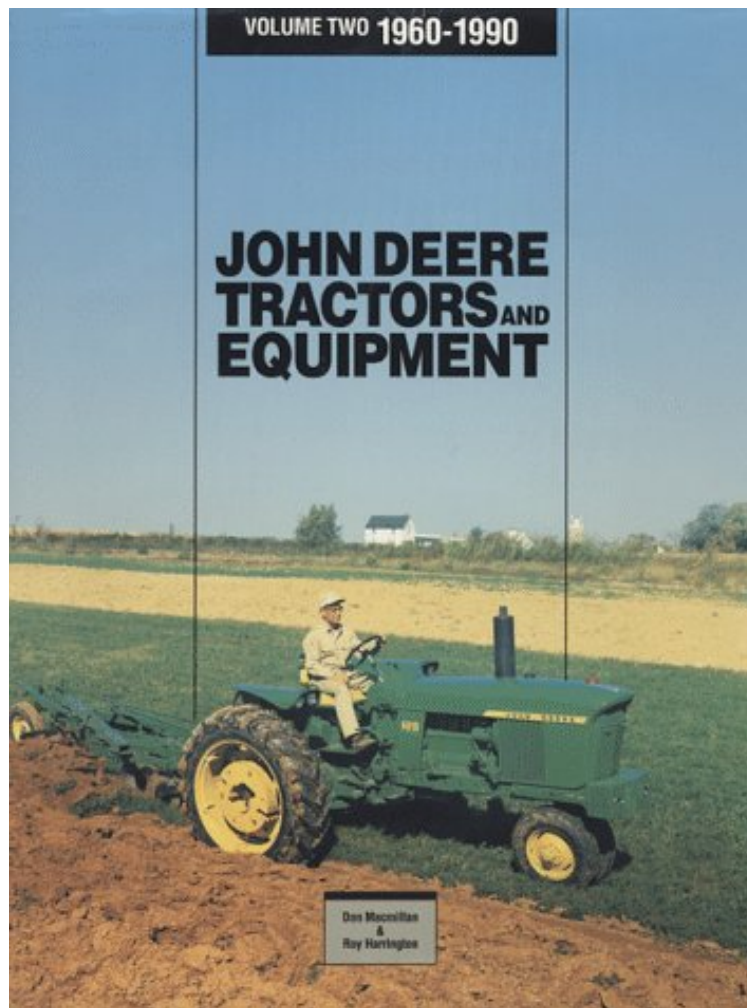

Macmillan is also the author of John Deere Tractors and Equipment Volume One, 1837-1959 and John Deere Tractors Worldwide: A Century of Progress 1893-1993. Roy Harrington contributes a unique engineering perspective of John Deere. His four decades of work at Deere Company include being manager of the product development department and, later, of the experimental farm near Moline. He ran the annual product engineers meeting for a decade, was a manager in the product and market planning department, and holds 21 farm equipment patents. He worked on the New Generation tractors starting in 1953, and in 1989 conducted a major phone survey on Maximizer combines. Harrington has also written three childrens books: A Tractor Goes Farming, Grandpas John Deere Tractors, and How John Deere Tractors Implements Work.
