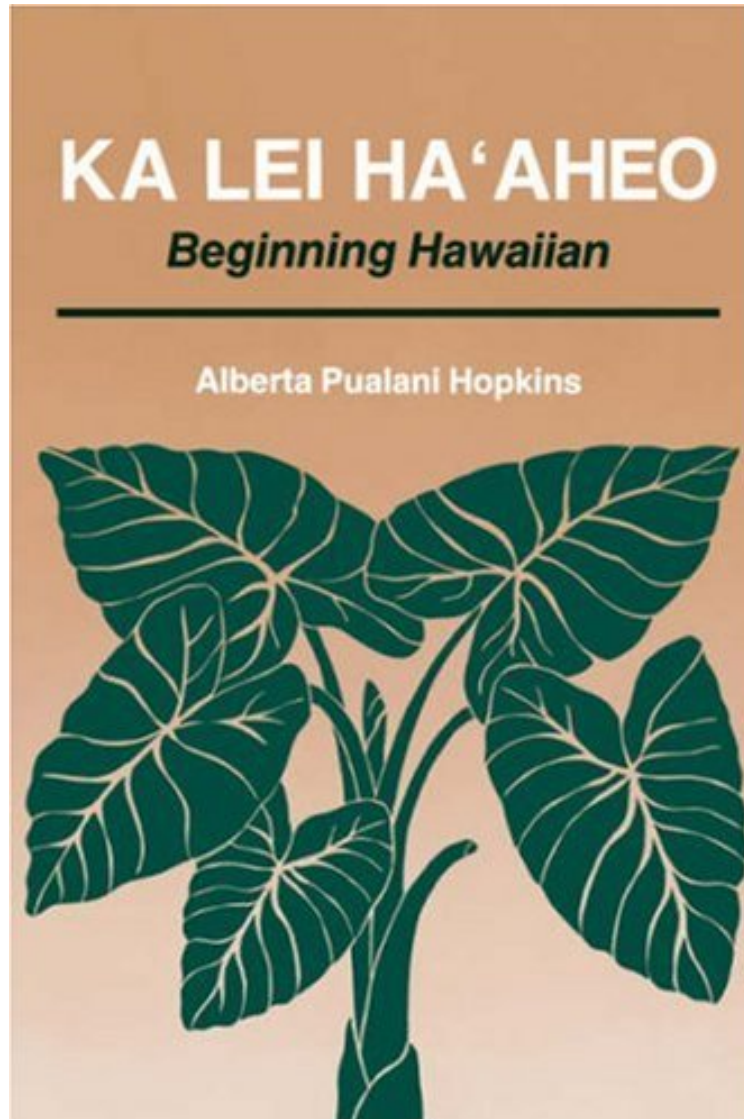

Hawaiian words in everyday conversation, but it's usually always combined with Pigin English and other languages. This book is great at teaching the basics of sentence structure.
