I borrowed this book through my Kindle Unlimited subscription. There are some very

good points made by the author against the program. However I would not have read this book if it was not free or part of the Unlimited subscription. I for one do not read 10 books a month. I read more like 10 books a week. So Unlimited definitely works for me. Since I am not writing a review of the program, but the book I will say that if you are on the fence about subscribing to Unlimited check out what Mark Heisenberg has to say. Limited Value to This Kindle Unlimited Guide By Silver Screen Videos In his short "guidebook" about Kindle Unlimited, Mark Heisenberg purports to give the pros and cons of 's service to allow consumers to decide whether Kindle Unlimited is a good bargain (although from the title "I Wish I Knew This Before Signing Up," you can guess where he stands on the subject). However, he omits one very important "pro" from his list. Namely, if you have Kindle Unlimited and for some reason choose to download a guidebook like this one, you won't be kicking yourself for having wasted 99 cents. Heisenberg claims on the page that this book is 30 pages long, but my guess is that, if printed, it would barely come to 20, and that's with a number of space-consuming bullet points and subheadings. The book starts with a brief discussion of what the service is and some statistics as to the number of books available. In addition, he mentions the alternative Kindle Owner's Lending Library that's available to Prime members and how the two services differ. There's no discussion of how to sign up for Kindle Unlimited, and, tellingly, he omits one of the most important details of all, namely the free-trial period, which allows people an opportunity to try out the service for 30 days before being charged. Heisenberg also provides some guidelines as to, in his opinion, what types of readers are likely to find value in Kindle Unlimited. Some of these guidelines are ridiculously obvious (people who read one or two books a month will find the service less attractive than those who read 10 to 20). Other guidelines are also valid but aren't that obvious, and I'm not going to go into them. But what's telling are his omissions. After noting that most of what's available on Kindle Unlimited is self-published, Heisenberg omits to add that there are literally tens of thousands of published books on there as well, not merely a handful of big name titles like the "Harry Potter" books as Heisenberg implies. He also omits to mention that a substantial amount of the fiction available on Kindle Unlimited is genre fiction, so that fans of mysteries, science fiction, romance, and the like will probably find more of interest here than those who primarily read mainstream fiction. Heisenberg's biggest omission is failing to give any suggestions regarding researching the actual titles that are available and that might interest a particular reader. To make matters worse, Heisenberg's obviously self-published guidebook is somewhat poorly written, with a number of grammatical and stylistic mistakes, along with some awkward sentence structure. It's hypocritical for Heisenberg to disparage self-published works in general, as he impliedly does repeatedly in his guidebook and, at the same time, produce a guidebook that exemplifies the worst characteristics of self publishing. Here are a couple of sentences from the guidebook: "If you are not from [the US and the UK] then you will not be able to avail of the program whether you want to or not." "[T]he quality of books in this service is questionable because they are highly diverse." "I don't participate in Kindle Unlimited, but I did get Heisenberg's guidebook for free when it was available as a promotion. And I already had a good grasp on the pros and cons of the service before reading this guidebook. My review and rating are based on how much value the guidebook provides to a novice. In my view, the handful of basic and obvious statements don't make up for the misleading and incomplete nature of the book. In addition, Heisenberg's poor writing style makes even this brief a book more difficult to read than it should be. Heisenberg's book has some minimal value. but there are a number of guidebooks that actually offer real guidance to people considering subscribing and that are well written to boot. Let Heisenberg's guidebook find the destination it deserves, buried at the bottom of the self-published Kindle Unlimited heap.
