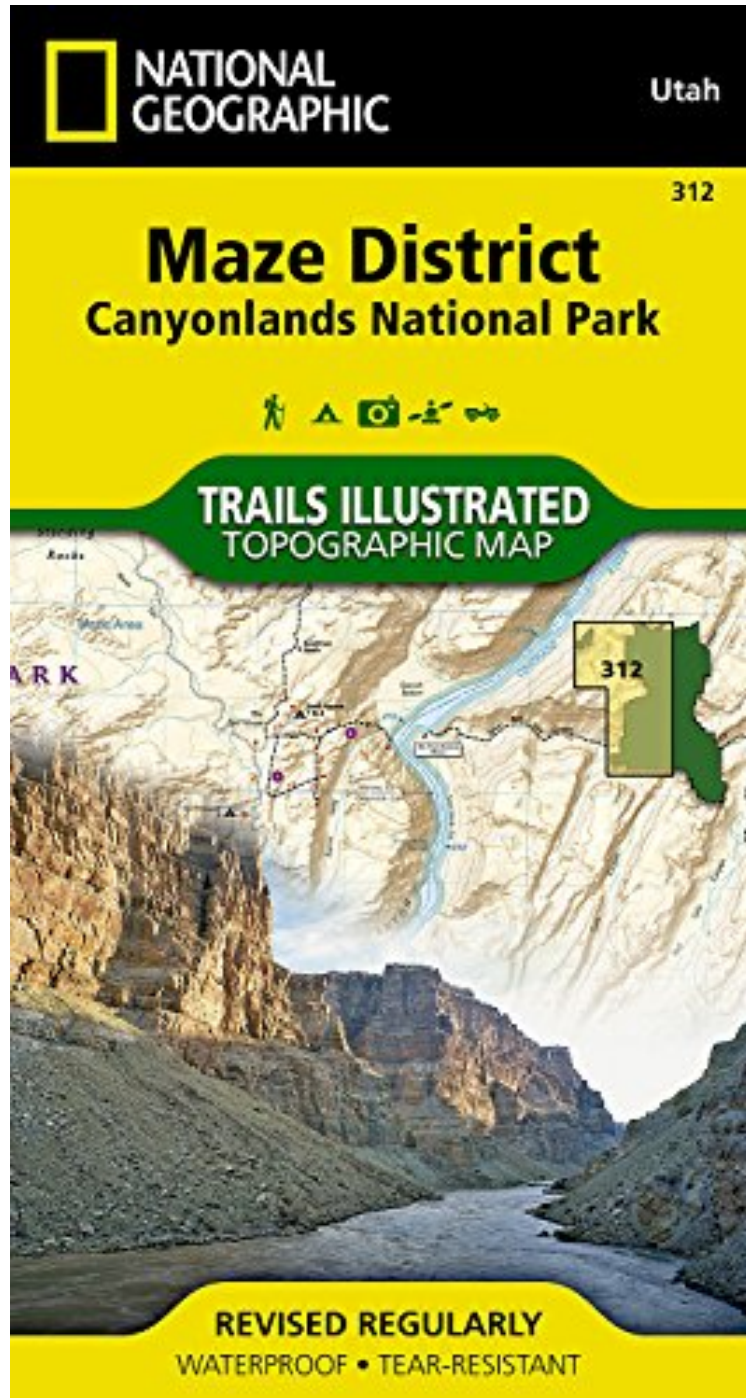

Very Little Detail--Possibly the worst map in the series By Phoenix Guy I have about a dozen Trail Illustrated (TI) maps and have in general been happy with them. The TI map for the Maze area of Canyonlands has very few labels and pretty much void of information. It is almost like looking at a blank Topo map. A lot of the Canyons and peaks are not even labeled. Chocolate Drops, Maze Overlook, The Great Gallery, Harvest scene and a few features are shown--maybe a dozen. The map is disappointing and of little help in finding anything as there are a lot of minor roads in the maze district that are not shown. Benchmark and Delorme maps of the area and even the maps in Kelsey's Canyonland book are much more useful. 8 of 8 people found the following review helpful. Adequate, but not perfect By Morrie Compared to the 1994 Trails Illustrated map entitled "Maze Area and Northeast Glen Canyon" which is no longer made, this covers less terrain but at a larger scale, 1:35,000 vs. 1:62,500. So you don't get Dark Canyon or any of the area south of Canyonlands. It seems strange that a map of the Maze would not show you the only road into the Maze from Hite. I also don't like the shaded relief of this map, compared to the older map, as it obscures useful contours. Of course being newer, it does have updated information, although not much has changed in that area in 20 years. Still it's good as an overview map and for jeeping. If you're going to hike, you would want the more detailed 1:24,000 USGS maps. You hardly need a waterproof map in an area where it rarely rains. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Recreation features are clearly marked, including campgrounds, picnic areas, points of interest, boat launches, and scenic overlooks. Every Trails Illustrated map is printed on "Backcountry Tough" waterproof, tear-resistant paper. A full UTM grid is printed on the map to aid with GPS navigation. Other features found on this map include: Canyonlands National Park, Glen Canyon National Recreation Area, Green River, Soda Springs Basin.
