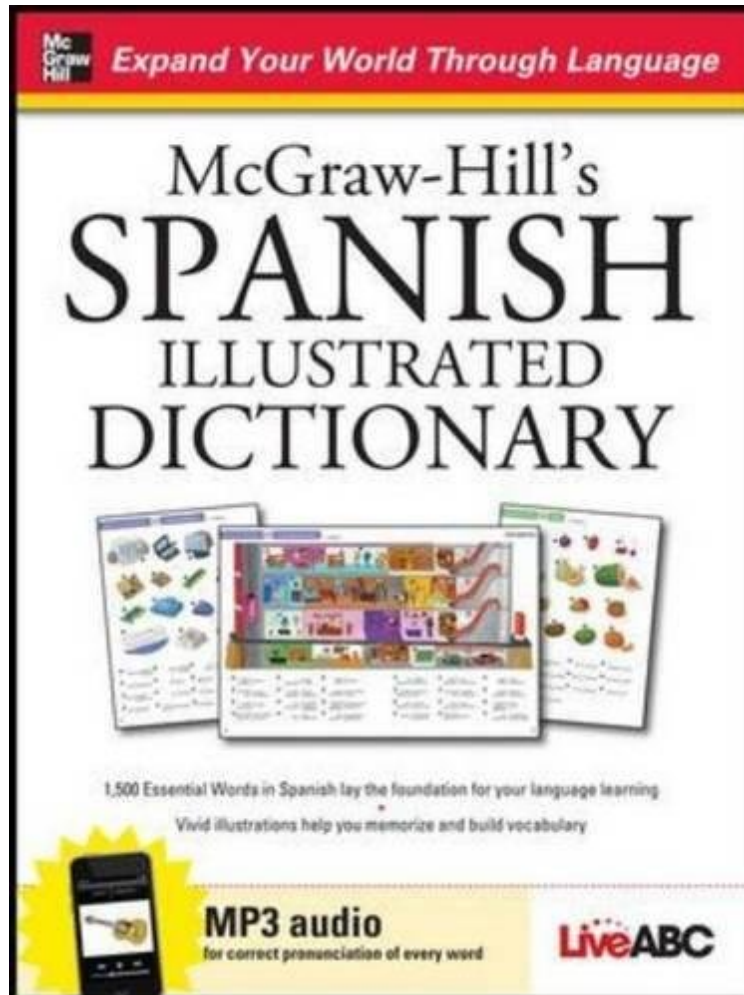

It would stand the abuse of a

library and kids. I have a few problems with the book, however, that make it not work for me, but maybe these aren't problems for you. First, I purchased it because I wanted audio pronunciation. The audio is only available on CD, you can't directly download from a website or play them directly on a website or a smartphone app. But the worst, for me anyway, is that the speaker in the audio is a female with a Castilian Spanish accent, and this isn't the best when you're trying to learn Latin American Spanish pronunciation -- there is a significant difference. This clued me in to examine the dictionary entries more closely, and yes, this whole book reflects Castilian, not Latin American, Spanish. For example, the book lists "el garaje" instead of the Latin American Spanish "la cochera." The majority of the words are common, so maybe it doesn't matter to you. I also noticed some verbs are listed as dictionary entries, and it's done in a confusing way because they aren't conjugated in sentences. For example, the book has an entry labeled "jugar videojuegos," and provides the definition "playing video games." Well, yes and no. There are many more examples, but you get the idea.
