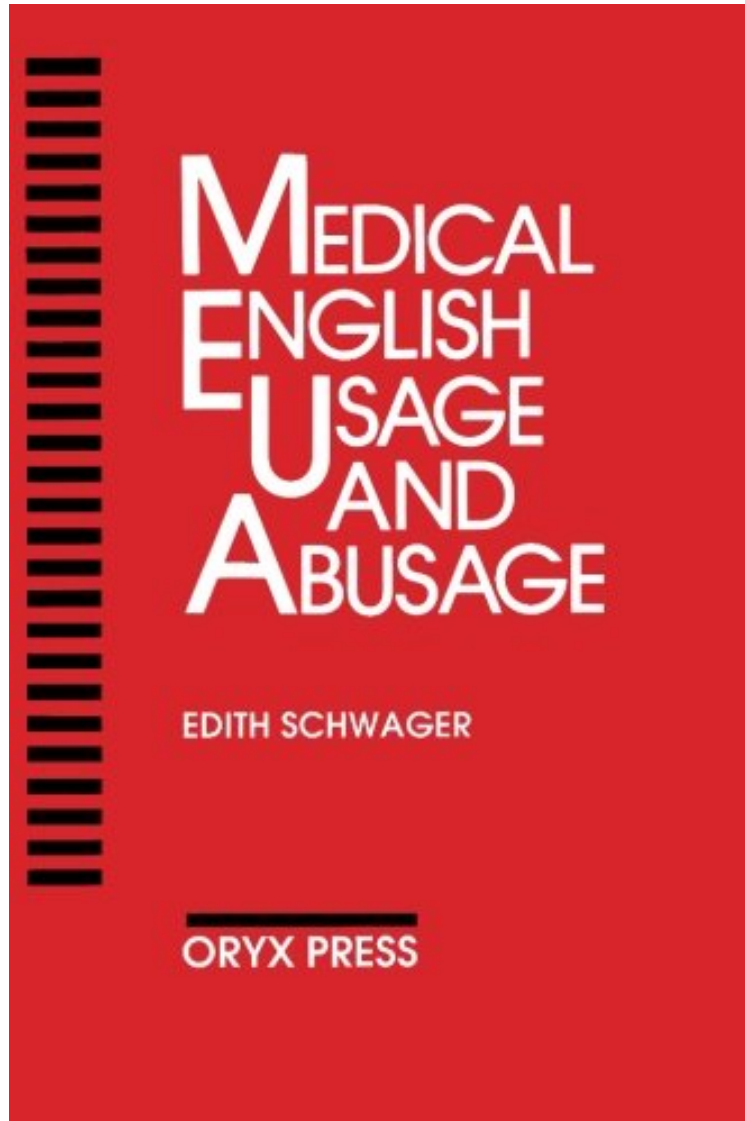

While this is an older book, its advice is still mostly relevant to today's industry (there are some parts about using a typewriter and typesetting that are really no longer needed today).Schwager filled this book full of little "gems" of advice. The approach is direct, easy to read, and often with entertaining insight and asides from the author. Much advice followed the format of 1) rule, 2) incorrect

example, 3) correct example, 4) further explanation. This book included many important grammar rules, along with other issues that pertain directly to scientific/medical writing editing, which makes this book a "must" for medical writers and editors.
