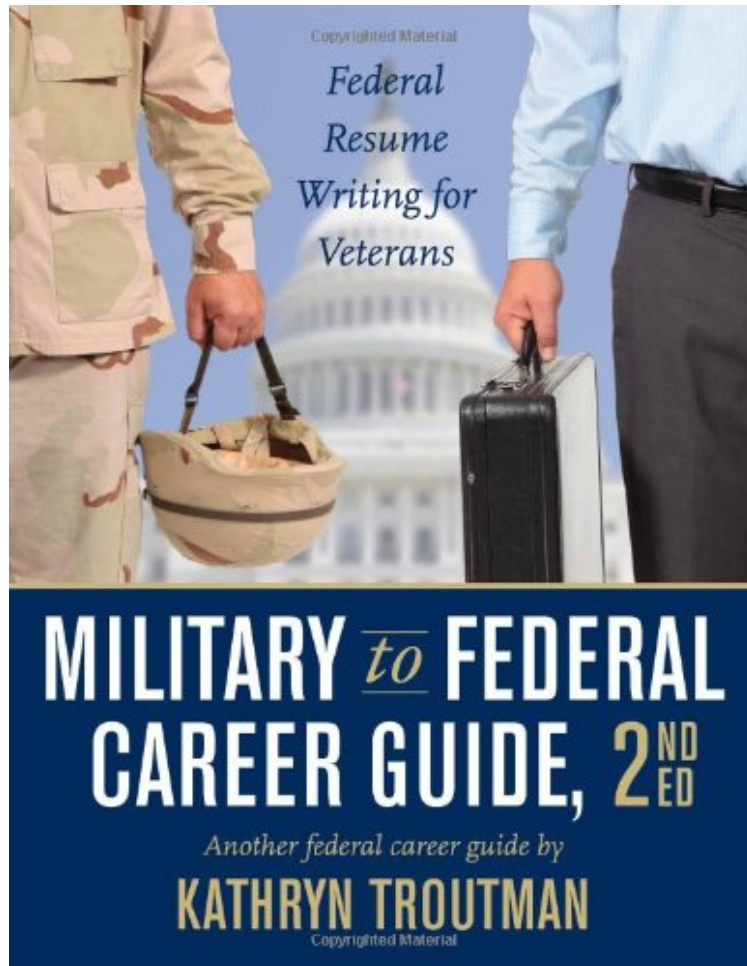

I wanted to post a cautionary warning about the CD. I ordered this book in physical copy because I wanted the CD. My husband got home and put the package on my chair, which my dog took and ripped open. When I got home I had 98% of the book left, but not the back cover or the CD. I assumed that my dog had done something with the CD so I purchased the Kindle version in order to have access to the CD content. When I opened up the Kindle version of the book, annotated

in the table of contents with asterisk around it was a statement saying that the CD content is only accessible if you purchase the book (physical or electronic) from the website resume-place.com. refunded me the money for the Kindle version, so great on for their exceptional customer service, however, now I am not sure that the version of this book actually came with the CD (also, no matter how amazing my dog is at ripping things to shreds, it is strange that there is absolutely no evidence of a CD anywhere in the house- not under the furniture, not in little pieces, not outside in the backyard, not stuffed into the couch cushions, nothing, but there is definitely bits and pieces of the back cover lying around enough to reconstruct most of it). The resume-place.com e-book is \$5 more expensive, but it might be worth it to order from the website just to be on the safe side for the CD content. Update: I would definitely recommend buying the book from the publisher website because it gives you the access code for the CD content in the first few pages of the book. The access code lets you download sample resumes, cover letters, and a lot of other stuff which you can update with your information instead of starting from scratch. Also, I used this book to update my resume and I started receiving emails saying that I was "minimally qualified," meaning I got past the first round of automated drops.
