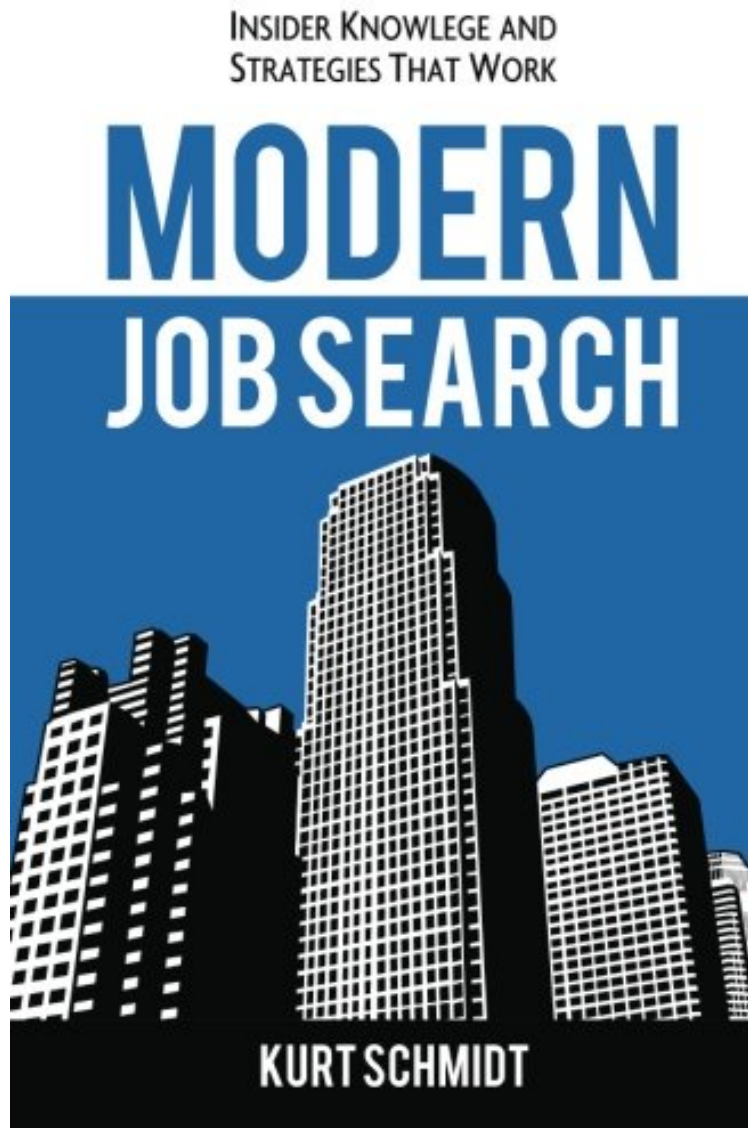

Working with Kurt was always insightful, and through his teacher/mentor approach I not only was successful in finding a leadership position but also learned a great deal about the process. I was naturally excited to learn he has now written a book on the subject. I was looking for a book on interview preparation and found Kurt's book "Modern Job Search" unique to others on the market. Rather than a laundry list of categorized question/answers, the book approaches the subject from a process perspective. The book follows three individuals at various levels of their career, from start to finish in the interview process. The scenarios reinforce the fundamental process from start to finish common at all levels, from preparation to follow-up. But it also highlights the dynamics that differ, for example if you are looking for a leadership position vs. an entry level job. Regarding standard interview preparation, rather than a laundry list of canned questions, Kurt laid out an incredible format to how you frame your answers so they are concise, demonstrative of results, and most importantly framed in a way to get feedback. A simple concept he demonstrates is how to follow up each answer with a question to get feedback. I was initially uncomfortable with this approach, but it worked incredibly well!! When I followed this approach, I found changed from an interview (me doing all the talking) to a collaborative discussion.
