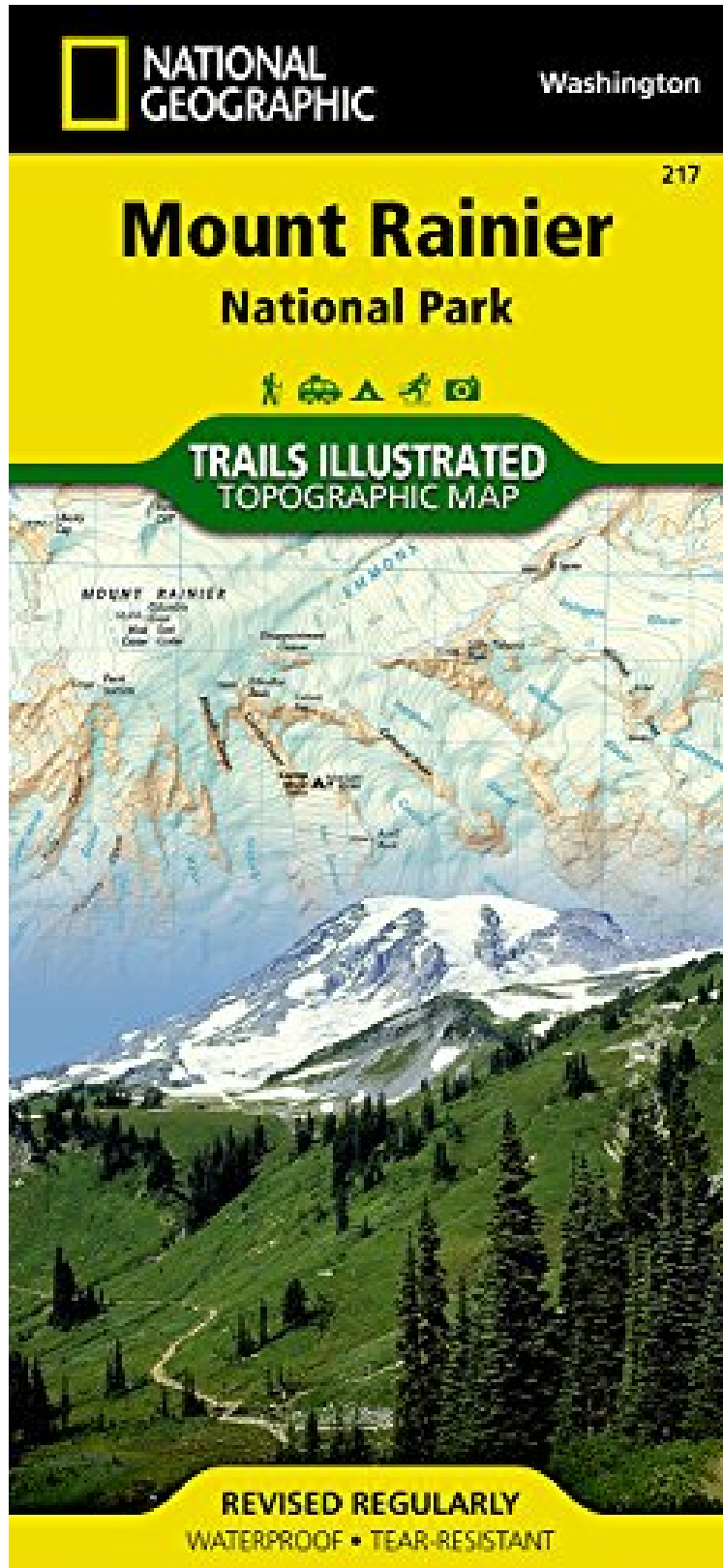

However, the actual position of the trails does not seem to agree with ground conditions. NG would probably attribute this to the freely available USGS data they used without validation to compose the map, which is likely somewhat dated. Also, the segment distances do not always agree with the NPS' posted distances. It is useful for planning a trip.
